UP IN THE AIR

AMEDEE ISLAND

[Amédée Island](#), with its lighthouse built in the 1890's, is a "must do" on any visit here. Just a 45 minute boat trip takes you there for the day, and includes lunch, glass bottom boat excursions, and shark feeding on the outer reef.

Duck Island is just 5 minutes by water taxi off the Anse Vata bay - and only A\$11.50 for the return trip. You can spend the whole day there soaking up the sunshine and exploring the underwater snorkel trail, or just relax in the bar!
